PTW PROFESSIONAL TRACK 2023 - 2024

The PTW Professional Track is for motivated students who are currently working professionally or who aspire to work professionally. This special series of classes offers an in-depth immersion into the process and technique needed to audition successfully.

You'll learn what you need to know to knock your professional auditions out of the park!

The focus of the Professional Track is for you to learn crucial audition skills and techniques needed, while offering opportunities to practice those skills and techniques in multiple settings. Masterclasses will connect you with industry professionals for their invaluable feedback and support.

There will always be factors that you can't control in the audition room. A casting director is looking for 4'8" or shorter, and you're 5'2". Or, from their perspective, you don't look like the character they are casting... things you can't control. The PTW Professional track addresses all the things you *can* control: your performance technique and your knowledge of how to deliver a top-notch audition.

When you audition for a top agent or casting director, there's no opportunity to get direct feedback from them on what they felt worked or didn't work about your performance. You're left to guess why you got or didn't get the part. The industry professional sessions of the PTW Professional Track take all the guessing out of the equation. You'll learn directly from top industry professionals what you're spoton with, and what about your performance would stop you from getting the part. Then you'll hear from that industry professional what you can do to address what's not working and how to bring your auditioning to the next level.

The PTW Professional Track includes five phases designed to facilitate your individual growth in the areas you need it most, as identified by our expert faculty and industry professionals. Each student will receive crucial feedback and help in strengthening individual weaknesses in order to overcome barriers to landing key professional roles and maximize your success at professional auditions.

Phase 1: *Prepare your material* with extensive, focused guidance from the PTW Professional Track faculty in one-on-one sessions.

Phase 2: Learn techniques specific to auditioning effectively with PTW Professional Track faculty in a masterclass setting.

Phase 3: *Practice and Polish these new techniques,* incorporating feedback from PTW Professional Track faculty to improve your audition skills.

Phase 4: *Perform for top industry professionals* in a series of master classes at PTW. Students will perform for top-notch industry professionals who specialize in placing children and young adults in Broadway shows, TV and film. You will get invaluable feedback and help from them.

Phase 5: *Incorporate* what you've learned to bring your audition skills to the next level.

PROFESSIONAL TRACK GOALS

In the Professional Track, you will:

- Acquire an understanding of how to audition for Theatre, Musical Theatre, TV and Film
- Learn how to make smart bold choices that make you stand out
- Learn how to hold yourself in the audition room
- Learn what you bring into the room and how you are seen
- Learn how to present your strengths
- Learn how to pick up and process choreography quickly
- Learn how to choose material for an audition
- Expand your repertory book with usable, age appropriate songs that contain correct cuts on the sheet music
- Gain confidence by getting lots of experience practicing auditioning for professionals, getting helpful feedback from them, and help incorporating that feedback
- Build a relationship with the Casting Directors, Agents, and Managers who shape the Broadway, TV, and Film scene
- Get invaluable feedback from real Casting Directors, Agents, and Managers that you wouldn't get in the professional world
- Receive feedback on Headshots and Resumes

The Professional Track will help synthesize all of the techniques you learn in core classes at PTW and help you apply them to auditions to land the professional roles of your dreams.

DETAILED COURSE DESCRIPTIONS AND GOALS

COMPONENT 1: MASTERCLASSES WITH PTW PROFESSIONAL TRACK FACULTY

In September and October 2023, February, March, and April of 2024, students will have classes in Musical Theatre Audition Technique, Theatre Acting Audition Technique, On-Camera Audition Technique, and Dance Audition Technique with the expert PTW Professional Track Faculty.

COMPONENT 2: PRIVATE LESSONS

Throughout the year, September 2023-June 2024, students will have private one-on-one instruction from the PTW Faculty in Song Interpretation, Acting and Voice.

COMPONENT 3: MASTER CLASSES WITH INDUSTRY PROFESSIONALS

In November of 2023, and April/May/June of 2024, students will perform for and get feedback from key, top-notch Industry Professionals in a masterclass setting. The October and November Industry Professional Masterclasses will focus on On-Camera skills, and the May and June Industry Professional Masterclasses will focus on a combination of Acting and Song Interpretation.

PROFESSIONAL TRACK COURSE DESCRIPTIONS & GOALS:

MUSICAL THEATRE AUDITION TECHNIQUE

This class will focus on building your Musical Theatre auditioning skills. You will learn what to expect, how to prepare for, and how to execute professional Broadway and Regional Musical Theatre auditions.

In the Musical Theatre Audition Technique classes, you will learn and practice:

- Building an audition repertory book
- Picking the *right* material that shows you at your best
- Entering and leaving the audition room
- Giving yourself the best possible map for your audition
- Giving accompanists your tempo and cuts
- What to say to the pianist before you sing
- Directing yourself "rules" for any audition song
- Truly connecting to your material
- Rolling with the unexpected in a positive way
- Maintaining a good attitude
- Owning the audition room

THEATRE ACTING AUDITION TECHNIQUE

This class will focus on building your Theatre Acting auditioning skills, focusing on scenes and monologues.

In the Theatre Acting Audition Technique classes, you will learn and practice:

- Making independent, bold choices
- Breaking down the text and understanding the world of the play
- Picking material that best serves you and what you are auditioning for
- How to effectively "cold read"
- Being flexible and taking direction

ON-CAMERA AUDITION TECHNIQUE

This class will focus on building your On-Camera (TV and Film) Acting auditioning skills.

In the On-Camera Audition Technique classes, you will learn and practice:

- Understanding and breaking down Film/Television scripts and sides
- Learning audition vocabulary, environment, and interaction with casting directors and/or producers
- Preparing for a professional Film and TV audition, including specifics in/how to: slate, wardrobe, expectations and preparation.
- Using the frame to establish environment in the scene
- Acting with the ease and clarity needed on film
- Working on camera, allowing you to gain invaluable experience after watching playback

DANCE AUDITION TECHNIQUE

This class will focus on building your Dance auditioning skills. By doing mock dance calls where you need to pick up choreography and perform in a matter of minutes, you'll increase your comfort level with dance auditions and learn how to make them the best they can be.

In the Dance Audition Technique classes, you will learn and practice:

- Picking up choreography quickly
- Standing out at a dance call
- Making the choreography your own
- Presenting yourself at a dance call
- Utilizing your acting skills in a dance call
- Approaching different styles of choreography

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS AND WHY EACH IS NECESSARY:

A. Requirement: Three 45-minute voice lessons to learn and choose possible songs with voice teacher, and two 45-minute sessions with director and musical director to finalize song choices, keys and 32-bar cuts (received in August or September).

Necessity:

To find great audition songs that maximize students' chances of landing roles that fit who they are as performers, and round out their repertoire books.

B. Requirement: 30-minute private voice for 10 weeks during the Fall semester plus 10 weeks during the Spring semester (Strongly suggested: 45 minutes).

Necessity:

To prepare student's audition songs from a vocal technique perspective and to develop strong, healthy vocal technique.

C. Requirement: 45-minute private Song Interpretation for 5 weeks during the Fall semester plus 5 weeks during the Spring semester:

Necessity:

- 1) To help the student understand what they "enter the room with" from a casting director's perspective.
- 2) To build the Song Interpretation aspect of the student's skills, preparing them for Industry Professional performances and any audition opportunity.
- D. Requirement: 30-minute private Acting for 5 weeks during the Fall semester plus 5 weeks during the Spring semester: choice of Monologue Concentration or On-Camera Training Concentration (Strongly suggested: 45 minutes).

Necessity:

- 1) To find a great monologue that matches the student and enables them to develop more sophisticated acting technique.
- 2) To help the student discover "who they are" as an actor and identify types of roles that best suit them.
- 3) To help the student better understand how to maximize the impact of their acting performances both for stage auditions and TV/film auditions using clear, specific acting techniques.
- 4) To help the student understand the difference between performing for theatre and performing oncamera, and to build the student's ability to cold read and prepare sides, adjusting appropriately for theatre or TV/film.
- E. Requirement: Although the Full PTW Track of Classes is highly recommended, the absolute minimum is one Acting, one Dance, one Song Interp (or Performing) PTW class and an additional course in an area of concentration (Acting, Dance or Voice) during both Fall and Spring semesters.

It is important students take these class requirements at PTW. By taking technique classes and private lessons at PTW, we ensure you are getting solid technique in each of these areas; at other schools, you may not be getting all the technique and skills you need that PTW private lessons and classes offer. Also, by taking PTW classes, you benefit from communication between Pro Track artistic directors and PTW class teachers that allows instructors to hone in on areas of need, specific to you — in class, private lessons and the Pro Track. Our Professional Track technique class and private lesson teachers discuss many aspects of each student's strengths and opportunities for growth so "one hand knows what the other is doing." This strategy also prevents students from getting mixed messages about technique from an outside school.

Highly Recommended: Full Track of PTW Classes in Acting, Ballet, Jazz/Hip Hop, Tap, Song Interpretation, Voice and Performing during Fall and Spring semesters.

When auditioning, you are competing against other performers who take a full array of technique classes You constantly need to be taking technique classes in order to sustain and evolve performing technique to stay competitive. More and more, agents and casting directors are looking for cast members who can act, sing AND dance with a high level of technique. Also, taking group classes is critical to developing the many collaborative-setting performance skills that private lessons cannot address.

Brian's long list of performing credits include, the Broadway production of *Grease!* (starring Rosie O'Donnell), the national/international tours of *Bye, Bye, Birdie* (starring Tommy Tune and Ann Reinking), *West Side Story* (Riff) and *Oklahoma!* (Will Parker — 50th Anniversary Production). Brian has most recently performed in The Taming of the Shrew at the New York Fringe Festival.

Joanna had the privilege to understudy Sutton Foster as Janet in the Broadway company of *The Drowsy Chaperone*.

Joanna is a member of the Midtown Direct Rep, through which she helped develop the musical, *Rated P ...for Parenthood*. Joanna starred in the Off-Broadway transfer of *Rated P* at the Westside Theatre in New York City, and can be heard on the original cast recording.

Nora Brennan, CSA Casting Director, Nora Brennan Casting

Nora Brennan is an ARTIOS Award winning Casting Director and a proud member of CSA. Established in 1999, Nora Brennan Casting is a full service casting office offering Theatre, Film and Commercial casting services.

Nora is currently the Children's Casting Director for *Matilda the Musical* on Broadway - Winner of four 2013 Tony Awards, with 12 nominations. In addition, the four original Matildas won a special Tony Award. Nora was also nominated for the ARTIOS award for Best Casting of a Musical for *Matilda*.

Nora also cast the children in the North American productions of *Billy Elliot the Musical* including Broadway and three tours. *Billy Elliot* won 10 Tony Awards including Best Musical and the original three Billys won a Tony for Best Actor in a Musical jointly — a first in Tony history! In the same year, Nora was awarded 2009 ARTIOS Award for casting the children in *Billy Elliot*. Tara Rubin was also awarded the 2009 ARTIOS award for casting the adults in *Billy Elliot*.

In addition, Nora Brennan is the Resident Casting Director for Transport Group and has cast many of Transport Group's world premiere musicals including: Michael John LaChiusa's world premiere of *Queen of the Mist* and his revival of *Hello Again, The Audience, All the Way Home, Crossing Brookly*n and *The Dark at the Top of the Stairs*, among others. Other featured projects include: the world premiere of *And Away We Go* by Terrence McNally, the TWiN film - *BAGMAN*, the revival of *West Side Story* at La Scala Opera House with international tours, and a series of commercials for acclaimed director Errol Morris for MoveOn.org.



Nancy Carson Youth Talent Agent, Carson-Adley Agency

Nancy Carson, owner of the Carson-Adler Agency, is internationally respected for high quality representation of young performers. An expert in her field, Nancy has been interviewed often on international television and is sought after as a speaker at industry seminars throughout the U.S.

As an advisor to the Actor's Equity Association's Children's Committee, Nancy actively works for the rights of professional children. In the early 80s, she

negotiated for her young clients and set the standard for requiring tutoring for children on tour, and was instrumental in getting mandatory tutoring written into the Equity Production Contract for Touring Companies. More recently, Nancy has been on the forefront of the movement requiring Broadway producers to provide tutoring starting with the rehearsal period and continuing until one week after opening night.

Nancy was also a leader in the movement toward non-traditional casting of children, representing the first African-American and Latino orphans in Annie, the first Asian and African-American girls to play 'Cosette' and the first girl to understudy Gavroche in *Les Miserables*.

She is on the speakers panel of the Screen Actor's Guild Young Performers Committee and is a member of the National Association of Talent Representatives. Nancy is also the author of *Raising a Star*— the parents' guide to helping kids break into theater, film, television or music.
